RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a proclamation in honor of the 1st Annual Himalayan Film Festival in Berkeley set to take place May 15-19, 2013.

BACKGROUND

The Himalayan Film Festival will debut at The Elmwood Theater in Berkeley on Wednesday, May 15. On May 18 and 19 screenings will take place at the Live Oak Theater during the Himalayan Fair.

Northern California has a strong connection to the Himalayas. Taking place in conjunction with The Himalayan Fair, which hosts 6,000 people each year, The Himalayan Film Festival will add an important educational and cultural event to the region and the fair, will promote discussion, education and advocacy alongside its film screenings.

Festival organizers are reaching out for community support to ensure a successful inaugural year with the intention of making it an annual event. Audience outreach will include advertising in local newspapers, radio stations, blogs, event calendars, postering and generating media interest through film debuts and filmmaker interviews.

Some of the films that will be screened are: The Road To Peace, State of Control, When Hari Got Married, Old Dog, Highway; No Look Pass; The Sari Soldiers; Soongava, Dance of the Orchids; Bitter Seeds, Beneath Everest, Leaving Fear Behind, Honey Hunters of Nepal, Himalayan Gold Rush, Into The Current
